-- Counting Down to Purple Pinky and PolioPlus!: Alison Pannell, chairperson for PolioPlus this year, writes, "Since 1979 Rotary and its committed members have been fighting Polio. Over 30 years and we are not done yet. Since those early days, we have reduced polio cases by a staggering 99% worldwide and there are only 2 endemic countries left, Pakistan and Afghanistan. However, with the dire conflict situations in these countries, immunization is severely curtailed and outbreaks are

now being reported more frequently. -- The war on this worldwide problem is not yet won. Governments around the world are acutely aware of the dangers of Polio, and the **Prime Minister of Australia** just committed \$100 million over 5 years to help eradicate Polio. -- Without Rotary's incredible effort, Polio eradication would not be nearly finished. Other strategic partners have now joined us, such as **UNICEF**, the **Centers for Disease Control**, and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation (that matches



\$2 for every \$1 we donate).

So we are very close with just two countries remaining endemic. Therefore, in an effort to raise awareness and encourage participation, our Rotary Club is again asking for your support in a Purple Pinkie Fundraiser that is aimed at the students of our community. The impact to our membership is a mere couple of hours of your time for one day to stain contributors' fingers purple, collect the funds, and spread the good word about Rotary.

Essentially, for every \$1 a student contributes, Rotarians and friends will paint that student's fingertip with Gentian Violet - a dollar being about the cost to immunize 2 children. October 24<sup>th</sup> is World Polio Day, so we will hold the event on that Monday. -- To promote the event, we will distribute a variety of posters, and provide some morning

-- Polio in Nigeria: From Rotary Weekly (on-line)
October 7, 2016 "Nigerian Health Minister Isaac
Adewole visited Rotary International World Headquarters in Evanston, Illinois, USA, Friday to discuss
Nigeria's efforts to stem the outbreak of polio. Three
cases in the northern state of Borno in August put the
country back on the endemic list. Adewole said his



country is treating the situation as 'a national emergency' and is determined to rid the country of polio again."

-- ShelterBoxes to Syria: As you have probably already read in a



recent e-mail, our Club Secretary,

Nancy Cerutti, received a letter
about the distribution of the two

ShelterBoxes our Club purchased
in 2015, originally expected to benefit survivors of the earthquake in

Nepal in April of that year. Even
though the boxes have just been
sent to Syria instead, they still serve

humanitarian purposes that are clearly greatly needed.

ShelterBox describes its work as, "We provide emergency shelter and vital supplies to support communities around the world overwhelmed by disaster and humanitarian crisis. When families are in need of emergency shelter, we will do everything we can to help them. -- Since ShelterBox was founded, we have responded to over 270 disasters and humanitarian crises in more than 95 geographic locations and provided emergency aid for well over one million people. -- The ShelterBox solution in disaster response is as simple as it is effective. We deliver the essentials people need to survive and begin to rebuild their lives in the aftermath of a disaster. -- ShelterBox aid is tailored to a disaster but typically includes a disaster relief tent for a family, thermal blankets and groundsheets, water storage and purification equipment, solar lamps, cooking utensils, a basic tool kit, mosquito nets, and children's activity pack." -- Rotary International is a proud partner is this relief effort.




**refugee** who became a US citizen in the 1940s. **Judge Armijo** will preside again. -- Watch for a volunteer sign-up sheet soon!

# 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of The Rotary Foundation (TRF)

As we begin our 2016-17 Rotary year, Rotarians around the world are beginning to celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of The Rotary Foundation. The first donation made

to TRF was in the amount of \$26.50, which is why you will see this figure or multiples of it mentioned in Rotary International literature this year. That amount now equates to more than \$530.00. -- RI writes, "At the 1917 convention, outgoing RI President Arch C. Klumph proposed to set up an endowment 'for the purpose of doing good in the world.' In 1928, it was renamed The Rotary Foundation, and it became a distinct entity within Rotary International. In 1929, the Foundation made its first gift of \$500 to the International Society for Crippled Children. The organization, created by Rotarian Edgar F. "Daddy" Allen, later grew into Easter Seals. When Rotary founder Paul Harris died in 1947, contributions began pouring in to Rotary International, and the Paul Harris Memorial Fund was created to build the Foundation."
