100th Anniversary of The Rotary Foundation (TRF)

As we begin our 2016-17 Rotary year, Rotarians around the world are beginning to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of The

Rotary Foundation. The first donation made to TRF was in the amount of \$26.50, which is why you will see this figure or multiples of it mentioned in Rotary International literature this year. That amount now equates to more than \$530.00. -- RI writes, "At the 1917 convention, outgoing RI President Arch C. Klumph proposed to set up an endowment 'for the purpose of doing good in the world.' In 1928, it was renamed The Rotary Foun-



dation, and it became a distinct entity within Rotary International. In 1929, the Foundation made its first gift of \$500 to the International Society for Crippled Children. The organization, created by Rotarian Edgar F. "Daddy" Allen, later grew into Easter Seals. When Rotary founder Paul Harris died in 1947, contributions began pouring in to Rotary International, and the Paul Harris Memorial Fund was created to build the Foundation."



Rotary Pay-It-Forward Raffle

I would like to **explain** the presence and use of the **Raffle** in our club. I feel that some members may not understand its purpose or (probably rightly so) may not understand its intent.

The raffle was designed as a third large fundraiser for our club to help us provide for and augment all the great work we do. Money from the raffle allows us to expand our good programs and add on new programs as they come to light. It provides us **flexibility** to do all of our good work and more. I learned this when I was grudgingly forced to make a budget for the club - we need more money if we want to do more stuff.

The raffle is designed to be simple, but have the capacity to raise appreciable amounts of money. I realize that it also requires us to do some selling, something that I am personally not fond of, but I have

tried to frame this in the scope of providing Rotary awareness with the possibility of selling a ticket or two. In other words, a way to start a conversation about Rotary that can only lead to opportunities.
