

-- 4-Way Test Essay Competition: Under the leadership of Andrea Cunningham, the 4-Way Test Essay Competition is underway after being postponed about one month due to illness at the District level. --



Mrs. Montoya, an 8th-grade LA Middle School Language Arts teacher, and most likely another teacher, will administer the competition this week during class time, as holding the writing competition after school reduces the number of students able to participate. The submissions, between 30 and 70, will be given to Andrea by March 24th.

Andrea will number and print out packets for all of the judges, probably by the 27th, with hopes of holding a quick meeting with everyone or meeting individually. Judges will be asked to read and pick their **Top**

10 by Friday, March 31st. On that day, Andrea will arrange a scoring meeting for all judges to review their Top 10 and narrow the winners down to the **Top 3** for **Club prizes and submission to District 5520 competition.**--Andrea will then submit the winning essay to the District, well before the April 7th deadline.



Andrea writes, "The week of the 27th is spring break for the schools, so the students will complete the essay as a side activity before they leave (it is the end of the quarter so there are limited graded assignments). As soon as they return to school, PAARC testing starts and is very hard and stressful for the students. to visit western Oregon and northern California next August 3-15. I am not yet


