-- Update from the March 25th District
Assembly: On Saturday the 25th, Pres.
Rob Metcalf was joined by Steve Ciddio, Linda Hull, Alison Pannell, and
Alex Zubelewicz at the District 5520's
inaugural District Assembly, organized by District Governor-elect Doreen

Kelsey. -- Sessions presented included how to talk about Rotary and why Rotary matters plus two sessions each on the new Grants Module and the Rotary Foundation.

-- District Changes to Grants: The biggest news from the Assembly appears to involve a revision in the way our District will process grant applications for 2017-18. Clubs will receive funding based upon how much money they gave to The Rotary Foundation's Annual Giving Program three years ago. If that was a poor year for giving, Clubs



may instead receive money based on giving an average of \$100 per person to the Annual Giving Program in the current year. Please note that money given to PolioPlus, to the Guatemala Water Coalition, and so forth *cannot be included* in this funding formula. -- Confused? Well, so were most of us! -- All I can tell you is that our Club will be given between \$2400 and \$3300 in Rotary year 2017-18.

The other surprise? Each Club may only submit one (yes, one) grant! For instance, if we wish to support our High School Equivalency grant with UNM-LA, our PEEC giving, and Interact's grant proposals, we must combine them under an umbrella title, such as Educational Outreach to Los Alamos Students.



-- 4-Way Test Essay Competition: Under the leadership of Andrea Cunningham, the 4-Way Test Essay Competition is underway after being postponed about one month due to illness at the District level. --Mrs. Montoya, an 8th-grade LA Middle School Language Arts teacher administered the competition last week during class time, as holding the writing competetion after school reduces the number of

students able to participate. The 27 submissions have been given to Andrea; she has numbered and printed packets, with students' names withheld, for all of the judges. Judges (Phil Dabney, Karen Easton, Laura Loy, Alison Pannell, Bethany Tierney, Alex Zubelewicz) will be asked to read and pick their Top 6 by Friday, March 31st. On that day, Andrea will arrange a scoring meeting for all judges to review their Top 6 and narrow the winners

down to the Top 3 for Club prizes and submission to District 5520
