Remember, **Crab Fest and Fiesta Los Alamos**, which primarily funds STARS projects, are our **big fundraisers** of the year!



-- Update: **Delancey St. Foundation-Matching Club Grant, \$6000 Submitted by Judy Goldie--**



Members of the club's **Delancey Street Foundation Committee** took a site tour **February 8** as part of the grant requirements the committee is shepherding. On this tour were **Stacey Castille, Myrna McDonald, Steve Ciddio, Brian Newnam, Anne Macek, Chris Sierk, and Judy Goldie**.

The **Ohkay Owingeh location** is quite impressive. It began as a private ranch and Delancey St. residents have enlarged the facilities, keeping a similar style, to include a variety of **vocational shops, a small farming area, horse stables, catering facilities, administrative offices, and event venues**. But the location is not the only thing impressive here. After a short "meet and greet," Rotarians were treated to **lunch** with residents and then to their **testimonials**.

"Everything is fixable" said one resident, and he meant himself, too. Self-identified as "the bottom 2%" of society, learning to be humble is an initial lesson at Delancey St. where new residents start with kitchen and serving duties. "I owe my life to Delancey," "I never had a role model before," "It is the reason I am alive – it was prison death or street death," were how many residents began their stories. The residents' life-changing experiences at Delancey Street underscored the impetus we felt as Rotarians to support this facility. What is often taken for granted—good parents, nice home, clean clothes, good and regular meals, school, safety, security, were unknown to most, if not all, of the residents.

The breadth of training offered, the personal stories, the services Delancey St. already provides to the community to keep itself solvent all are part of this amazing effort to not only reclaim lives but rebuild them into contributing members of society.

Postscript: Rotary is no longer just a name at Delancey St. Members were able to explain what Rotary is, its worldwide service, and what we are a part of when we say, "I am a Rotarian."

Our next RFE travel opportunity will be to **Sweden** from **August 15 - 27**. The travelers will need to fly early enough to arrive in **Stockholm** no later than August 14 for an overnight, then they will take the train to their hosting destination in D238.

Most Swedish citizens speak English, so the language issues should not be a barrier to anyone. **All travelers would be**

responsible for their transportation to/from the hosting district, some meals, and some sightseeing expenses. But the hosts will provide a private bedroom, bath, and breakfast, and some other meals and sightseeing. The real advantage to the RFE program is the opportunity to see/experience another country from the local viewpoint rather than as a traditional tourist.
