When GED trademarked its name, other companies produced their own tests to show competency for the equivalency of a high school diploma. Although most members of the public know the diploma as GED, the HSE exists alongside it and is what UNMLA administers to the Delancey St. students and other students who take the exam through the community grant we have with them. It seems like a small point, but our Club does not provide fees for GED testing, per se, only pre-paid vouchers for HSE exams.

responsible for their transportation to/from the hosting district, some meals, and some sightseeing expenses. But the hosts will provide a private bedroom, bath, and breakfast, and some other meals and sightseeing. The real advantage to the RFE program is the opportunity to see/experience another country from the local viewpoint rather than as a traditional tourist.
