Our next RFE travel opportunity will be to **Sweden** from **August 15 – 27**. The travelers will need to fly early enough to arrive in **Stockholm** no later than August 14 for an overnight, then they will take the train to their hosting destination in D238.

Most Swedish citizens speak English, so the language issues should not be a barrier to anyone. All travelers would be

responsible for their transportation to/from the hosting district, some meals, and some sightseeing expenses. But the hosts will provide a private bedroom, bath, and breakfast, and some other meals and sightseeing. The real advantage to the RFE program is the opportunity to see/experience another country from the local viewpoint rather than as a traditional tourist.
